## **Redeeming the Time – Are we investing or spending our lives?**

"So teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (Psalm 90:12)

"Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"—yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." (James 4:13-14)

 Given what we have covered in this series, consider the question...
 "Am I investing or spending the time and opportunities God has given me?" or put another way... "Am I making the most of opportunity or frittering away life in trivia and half-hearted service?"

2. Read Ephesians 5:15-16 Christians are to carefully observe how they live, that it be in wisdom. Put another way, **Paul is commanding believers to walk [live] as wise men and women.** Living wisely **includes the idea of stewarding the time (opportunity) given to each of us.** 

This speaks to the imperative of investing our time on earth with a transcendent perspective, meaning, and significance in view. Our privilege of time and opportunity is limited. Using time well is a matter of "redeeming" the time and opportunities given.
